Fifty years walking down memory lane I feel so nostalgic and it even brings a tear to my eyes when I think of those days walking down the Lalbagh Road from Fuller Hostel to Dr F S Dawns' residence. Dr & Mrs. Dawns, though foreigners, had a very close affinity with the people from the Northeast and particularly with us Naga students and for that matter I also had a great rapport with the said couple.

We were extremely grateful to Dr & Mrs. Dawns as they most willingly sacrificed to be the Treasurer of the newly-formed Naga Students Union Bangalore. Those days most of the Naga students were from the various theological institutes in the city and by the given circumstances the new Union was formed at the United Theological College in Miller's Road, Benson Town where the late Rev Deo was also there in a mission (for translation of the Holy Bible). As such, Rev Deo was automatically nominated as the first and founding President of NSUB while I was nominated as the first General Secretary of the Union. In addition, we also had a blessing in the form of Rev Dr Thumra and his family with us in Bangalore who accepted to be the Advisor of the newly-formed Union.

Though it is already late in the day I would, nevertheless, like to give due appreciations to our deceased members like Dr Inakhe, Rev Vetokho, Er Temjenwati Walling, Charles Angami and most of all, Rev Deo for their invaluable contributions and cooperation during my tenure. May their souls rest in eternal peace.

I also have fond memories of my old friends Akong Longkumer, retired Director, Treasury & Accounts Nagaland, Limaakum, who preferred to live in Australia; Sentila Subong (Junker) who settled in Germany and my own younger brother O. Alem, retired DGP Nagaland, and a host of others.

It was during the Silver Jubilee of NSUB that I was made known the dire necessity of a Typewriter for the Union. Accordingly I arranged a Remington Rand for the Union to mete their requirement to be in their possession. I wonder where is that obsolete machine lying rusted in some corner now! But I believe it has served its purpose in its time.

I have thousand other fond memories of the 'Garden City' and all those activities in the Union.

Reminisce: Bangalore

With great joy, I accepted to write a brief reminiscence of my days in Bangalore from the years 1989-1991, then I was doing my Master of Theology at The United Theological College (UTC), Benson Town. As all would agree that we are in a changing world. The name of the city of our time has been changed from Bangalore to Bengaluru, while even the naming of the street has been changed and you may name them many more.

An organization, no matter how big or small with continuity of fifty years has much to be appreciated for its existence; The Naga Students' Union, Bangalore and, with an simple measurement; because of its positive contributions, it has grown till half a century. What I had experienced during these long years of The Naga Students' Union, Bangalore, were just two years and so I wish to pen down few lines.

The Naga Students' Union, Bangalore, fresher's day in 1989 was held at Charles Ranson Hall, UTC, sometime in August. Mr. Fresher was an Angami boy while Miss fresher was an Ao girl, and we elected Mr. L. Mongkum Jamir as the President of the Union. He was then a student of Electrical Engineering. I was already a married student with a child, hence I behaved like an elderly man, yet I was nominated for the Secretary of Vigilance committee, a creation of this post was for the first time and later it seems this portfolio was dropped from the Union.

As Secretary of Vigilance, Naga Student Union Bangalore

Although, I have been to Bangalore city many times (as a member of Student Christian Movement of India), I was not very sure of many institutions and area, while as per the NSUB Constitution, the duties and function of Vigilance Committee was to 'guide all the members to abstain from social evils and live as good members of Society, while if involved in such activities may be punished to the extent of sending home.' It was for the welfare of the Naga people in Bangalore.

As members of the Vigilance committee, the committee members went around various towns to encourage and also warn and make sure that students in Colleges were seriously studying, while for those who lived in rented houses were found violating the norms of the NSUB disciplinary rules were being questioned and later sent home with proper information with their parents. As student community, we were not a charitable organization, yet on events of few deaths, the Union was involved so much in assisting the bereaved families. I remember two Sumi students (names forgotten) met with an accident and the Committee rendered maximum support to the bereaved family. There was another similar accident case, where an Ao boy was studying medicine in Hosur, we came to know only through the newspapers the next day, his name was Johnshiba Mar (later known as Jongshiba Mar) met with an accident in Bangalore-Hosur road. We waited for his parents and he was buried at the All Saints' cemetery. The burial was conducted by Mr. Allen Longkumer who was a chaplain by then. Thus, in many ways, the NSUB was extending support, love and care and encouragement to members.

Naga Fellowship to Naga Christian Fellowship (NCF): There used to be two parallel units among the Nagas (both Nagas from Nagaland and Manipur), a Student Union and Worship units where 'Fellowship' meeting were conducted every Sunday. In order to function as a better organization, this Fellowship was renamed as The Naga Christian Fellowship, and sought the support from The Nagaland Missionary Movement, the Mission Dept. of The Nagaland Baptist Church Council (NBCC), the first Chaplain was Mr. Allen Longkumer and his wife Mrs. Aola.

During those days the Naga Fellowship had problem in procuring an appropriate place for fellowship, hence sometimes we met at the UTC Tagore hall, BBBC chapel Hall or All Saints' Church. However, meeting in different places from time to time was another reason for not being able to come and enjoy the fellowship. Finally, the All Saints' Church allowed us to have a regular meeting, which gave more meaning to our Fellowship. (Am not sure, if the NCF Bangalore have the same name and same meeting place)

Journey to Bangalore - A dream in life journey: Fiftieth anniversary of the NSUB is celebrating with a theme, 'Building Resilience Beyond Challenges,' sounds fascinating and impressive. However, it's not the theme nor the years we celebrate but the transformation of mindset of every member that matters the most. 



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Nagas in a Changing World

On the occasion of the 50th Anniversary celebration of the Naga Students' Union, Bangalore (NSUB), a reflection is offered in joyful memory of my own formative years here in the city as well as in the hope for a bright future of the younger Naga generation. Personally, both the NSUB and the Naga Christian Fellowship (NCF) in the city provided ample opportunities for growth, and the friendships forged in the city delight me as I recall fond memories of kindness and hospitality of friends and mentors.

Between the years of 1969, 1994 and 2019, Bangalore has seen tremendous changes in every aspect of life, not least in the exponential population growth and the entrepreneurial initiatives especially in the IT sector. Naga Students' history and experience would not be different. We have seen growth in numbers and we note the excellent talents participate in different aspects of the city – economy, education, entrepreneurship etc.

Indeed, the milestones achieved by members of the NSUB inspire thanksgiving, confidence, and to strive for excellence. The occasion of the NSUB golden jubilee also beckons us to reflect towards the future.

We are living in a time of unprecedented changes. The explosion of technology has transformed every aspect of life – communication, health, education, economy, even personal spirituality among others. We are living in the Anthropocene age, inaugurated by humanity's thirst for progress, and control of the whole creation. The Anthropocene period has seen revolutions that have radically transformed humanity. In the words of historian-academic Yuval Noah Harari, "We have mastered our surroundings, increased food production, built cities, established empires and created far-flung trade networks....we have made real progress as far as human condition is concerned, with the reduction of famine, plague and war." (*Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind*)

The tremendous changes have also ushered in immense challenges that affect quality life and contentment. The signs of times today are marked by some of the following realities: migration of labourers to urban centres, growing wealth amidst unprecedented inequalities (according to an Oxfam report 26 billionaires own global wealth as much as the poorest 50% of the world's population), an uncertain time for the way wealth is created (capitalism), the environmental crisis (as has been brought to global attention in the recent time by the Swedish teenager – Greta Thunberg), an impending health crisis caused by

resistance to antibiotics, food insecurity, rising nationalist politics (often anchored on a regressive interpretation of religions), growing consciousness of minorities, rise of Artificial Intelligence (AI) with potential threat to labours (especially unskilled), and threat of bio-chemical disaster. In depicting the signs of times, a Cassandra I am not, but rather it is to situate a reflection for the future that should take into account the present realities.

The giant leap of progress humanity has made is not without the darker side of threat to life and the whole creation. Again Yuval Harari sums up aptly, "we are more powerful than ever before, [but]... humans seems to be more irresponsible than ever....we are accountable to no one. We are consequently wreaking havoc on our fellow animals and on the surrounding ecosystem, seeking little more than our own comfort and amusement, yet never finding satisfaction." (*Sapiens: A Brief History of Humankind*).

Human selfishness and insatiable greed have not been overcome in the progress. Nagas also inhabit the modern world with all its promises as well as the malaise. Our reflection and action towards the future as a people should be anchored in the knowledge of the changes and challenges of the time.

Another marked reality of modern Nagas is the invariable location of our history and culture on the resourceful mountains between ancient civilizations and modern rising global powers. Naga people reflection towards a future of confidence and flourish of every member should begin with this awareness of our strategic location and history as a people of the mountains that hold the land and its resources as sacred to be respected and stewarded for the next generation.

With this as backdrop, Nagas in a changing world need to be aware of four defining marks as a people: Land, Religion (Christianity/Church), Gender, and Education. While the challenges before the Nagas are not limited to these four, these four areas are related and are crucial to the flourish of the people.

"When the last tree is cut, the last river poisoned, and the last fish dead, we will discover that we can't eat money" is a saying from the Cree (First Nations people of Canada). Development, progress and wealth need to be balanced with sustainable stewardship of the land of our ancestors. If we bargain with our land today, our children will be landless victims tomorrow.

Experience of Christianity and the role of the church among the Nagas is complex. Christianity initiated us towards the modern agents we are today, enabled to participate in the global world (Robert Eric Frykenberg). And Christianity in its prophetic tradition can transform us to a just and flourishing society. Christianity that is critical of materialism as idolatry and Christianity that embraces the strange and the unfamiliar in a radical love remains resourceful to inspire Nagas towards a just society.

If Naga society today is seen as a society with high literacy rate with women in every profession, it is because Naga women were not curtailed in acquiring the education Christian missionaries introduced. In fact, among some Naga tribes, women made up the first students of the informal learning class held by the wives of missionaries. As Naga ancestors took the nascent

step towards modernization, they were broad-minded in ensuring women to be educated and partake in modern professions. Equal participation of women in every aspect of Naga society stands to gain the whole Naga society.

Nagas are known for acquiring education, which is evident today in the many young Nagas contributing in diverse sectors of the country – higher education, IT, central services, research, etc. Education that nurtures critical consciousness, builds character, equips for global participation, and helps cultivate virtues for the common good are the need of today.

Nagas in a changing world are called to collaborate, beyond one's familiar network and immediate relationship. Artificial barriers created by vested interests are challenges to the flourish of Naga people. Nagas in a changing world need to cross the boundaries we have constructed to our own detriment. Our history and destiny is our own, we need to deliberately construct a future that is inclusive, and flourishing for all, rising above selfishness.

In 1955 Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat in the bus, an action that mobilized the Montgomery Bus Boycott during the Civil Rights movement in America. "Tired of giving in" Rosa Parks ignited a movement of freedom from segregation. Freedom and the good life we envision as Nagas. May we leave meaningful footprints and may God guide us with his eternal wisdom.

Away from home we make our own shelter, Reviving traditions from withering into dust And strengthening ties between bloods twined. Our spears and shields once trained on each other Fused over years of harmony into a golden aegis.

Revisiting the Naga Kitchen: Building Resilience beyond Challenges

Pre-script

Anthropologists who came from the west to the Naga Hills during the colonial era observed and wrote about the Nagas as a tribe who are fierce, honest, brave, and hospitable in nature. The narrative has been that the Nagas as a tribe were apt with the challenges of the era. The way, the foremothers and forefathers behaved courageously and ingeniously shaped the course of the Naga history-society and it has been handed down from generations to another era. They say a person cannot be a true patriot in empty stomach or that one does care less about the world and the nation when the belly is disoriented and empty. Keeping this in mind, the essay will trot the path of fostering a narrative on the Naga kitchen as an epitome of the politics of love, hope, justice, and spirituality. Nagas are forever known for their hospitality and that to delete hospitality from the Naga society would mean there will be no Naga-ness to be affirmed to the people.

The Naga Kitchen

Kitchen in the Naga homes is the cradle of physical needs, in addition to it, it is a harbinger of social, cultural, political, and ideological deliberations. The vicinity of the kitchen in the homes is located to the best location available for access to its family members and the visitors, the friends, and the circles. Traditionally, Nagas entertained family matters and issues in the kitchen especially, by the burning wood fireside. In the event of major issues, problems, and happy scenarios, the family gathers at the fire place and sorts out all discussions. In the event of a journey towards a new endeavor or that of a physical journey, the family gathers in the evening to talk and sort out the discussions. The same is for visitors at home. Usually, people come looking at the kitchen, not in the sitting room nor the drawing room, and that people meeting in common room

is a new phenomenon which of course is not so popular in the traditional family. The kitchen had for centuries been a place of nourishment for the family as well as for the society in the tribal setup.

Narrative of Politics

The Naga kitchen seems to be losing its hallmark of being an epitome and harbinger of life, hope, faith, and love in the tribal society. The degradation of the ethics and morality of the Naga kitchen seems to be lost in the transition between the lust for money and power in the present day scenario. Today, Nagas at home seem to be entangled in the ills of class systems that no longer care for the spirit for hospitality as the lust for greed seems to have overtaken the morality of the society. The morals of the kitchen seem to be darkened with the abrogation of the ethos and value for the love of the society. Everything that shaped and made the Naga nation true to its identity is on the verge of destruction owing to the ever rising ills of corruption, tribalism, sectarianism, and the lust for money and greed for power. Everything that the ancestors handed down from one generation to another is on the brink of extinction, more of the Naga-ness. In such a situation, the quest is to come back home to the Naga kitchen to get back the ethos and morality of the kitchen.

Pioneers of the Naga movement declared Nagalim for Christ as an epitome of their faith and trust in God for the Nagas. It is a fact that Nagas had their spirituality and religious affirmation even before their conversion to Christianity. Yet, there are still a small percentage of the Naga population holding on to the religious beliefs and tradition of the ancestors. Yet, the message is that of the comparison between Nagas before Christianity and the Nagas post conversion to Christian faith community. It is always said that Nagas were honest, industrious, brave, fierce and hospitable in nature. They said in the good old days, people did not lock their homes nor that of their properties for stealing was absent in the society as life was engulfed in the morals of honesty and integrity. However, the life situation has become a reversal today with the ideals of honesty and integrity been overshadowed by corruption, nepotism, tribalism, sectarianism, denominationalism and others. Above all, the political corruption perpetrated through the Nagaland State Assembly elections seems to be the mother of all corruption in Nagaland. It is the cradle of nepotism, partisan politics, clan-ism, and to an extend tribalism. The Nagas seem to have lost the way of the Kitchen paradigm; the narrative of sharing and hospitality to each other based on the morality for each according to what is due. The ethics of sharing and hospitality and therefore the curse of stealing and coveting of public properties seem to have diminished from the Naga society.

Social justice, basic human necessities, minimal development, and human growth seem to elude the Nagas today. Basic motorable roads, water necessity and electricity, social welfare measures and facilities have become a farcry in Nagaland. The question is the non-activity of the people to make the politicians answerable to the inhuman living conditions or that of the complacency of the people being used to the problems and struggles of everyday life. Yet, one thing is sure, things are not right in the Naga society today and without revisiting the ideals of the Naga kitchen the society is not going to do better. And the

most startling ill of all is the politically induced corruption that has the society entangled in the wrong side of politics. Buying of votes and government jobs has become normal business, that it does not find any sign of shyness by the person indulging in this business. They say one cannot be a patriot in an empty stomach so also one cannot be a spiritual being with an empty stomach especially when the plate that is due to them has been stolen and given to others by the people in power. In the event of a plate being forcibly taken away through unfair means, how does one expect individuals to be true to the spirit for when the flesh is burning one cannot keep the spirit in peace.

Back to the ethos and the morality of the Naga kitchen is what could be sought in the quest for the restoration of the Naga society. In the kitchen, none were denied of physical satisfaction for hunger, thirst, and needs. It serves as the epitome of an institution which took care of the poor, the hungry, orphans, widows and the travellers. It can help inform the church and society about the ways of restoring humanity to the ways of the creator. With majority of the Nagas as Christians, one can not help but wonder the faith of the church being reflected through the society. The church is the reflection of the society and one can ponder whether the situation of the society could be highlighted by its indication through the church. In such a context, the church as the harbinger of life should address the issues that bring moral, social, political, economic death in the Naga society. Tribal society has always maintained a symbiotic relationship between religion and politics for they were neither separated nor joined together rather they were always in dialectics for the good of humanity. In this way, the church needs to take up its political roles seriously to render to God on what belongs to God and to Caesar what is due.

In a way the time has come right for the church to engage in narratives where it addresses social and political problems within the Naga kitchen and society that people will experience social welfare and justice in this life on the earth. No longer can the church limit its ministry to that of preaching on Sundays and disciplining people caught in the web of drinking, smoking, chewing of tobaccos and that of indulging in unlawful extra marital affairs. Of course, these mentioned habits draws individuals away from the spirituality and worship life of the church. However, the greater thrust that remains is the question of the church on people indulging in political and economic corruption in addition to moral corruptions. Can the church dare to question the ills and morality of the political corruption in Nagaland? It might not be an easy task for the church also needs to stand firm on its own. Like the task of disciplining individual morality, the church also needs to take into confidence the people in power and authority to take and make them responsible towards the society. In a way, could the church dare to discipline people caught in corruption to the extend, people in nepotism an electoral corruption? Time would only tell, yet, the church needs to be weary of its responsibilities least it becomes irrelevant in a society that is fast becoming secularized. Only when the church and the society take the poor and the weak into confidence that it can act as the kitchen for quenching the thirst and hunger of the individuals.

In every history, time always gives an opportunity for people to act and transform the society from that of the struggling scenario to that of something heroic for the greater good of the society. In times such as this, when the students' community in Bangalore is celebrating the five decades of existence as a community in the garden city, the time challenges us once again to remain truthful to the mores, ethics, culture, and tradition of our ancestors. We can sit back and mourn all the things that have gone against our way or the things that happened on the wrong side of life. Yet, there is always the opportunity to rise to the challenge and sort out the issue hampering the growth of our society. If the ills of corruption, nepotism, tribalism, and sectarianism is flourishing in our society today, it will be because we as a community did not rise to the occasion to counter all such ills and wrong ways. Looking back on the journey of fifty years would mean that we have come so far, for life is a journey till the end. Through this celebration, let us all together be challenged to rise above our petty issues and ideological differences and come together as one community without borders and boundaries. Let this be the year that we come together as one, for the reconstruction, revitalization, and reconstruction of our land. May we return to the ethics of our kitchen for posterity for they say charity begins at home, and to make our society strong at home and abroad we got to make our foundation strong and it begins from the kitchen. It will be hypocritical of calling for a future with aspirations without being established and rooted in the kitchen. The time has become ripe to celebrate and make way to celebrate our tradition and culture. May our celebration of oneness and unity inspire individuals over the hills and valleys of Nagalim to be united in the spirit of greater future posterity build on hope, liberty, justice, and fraternity. Let the celebration of jubilee bells ring over the land of the Nagas with a call for unity and liberty under the sun. 'Until the Sun Shines over the Naga Hills'

Every year around 30,000 students clear their 10 and 10+2 exams from Nagaland and another 10,000 students clears their undergraduate exams. But where do all these people go? What do they do after this in our state of Nagaland where we hardly have any institution and industry to empower them? The unanswered questions for economists, government, industrialists of Nagaland. To some or many, they go out of the state in search of Education and Jobs.

Over the past few decades, many young Nagas went out of the state to get better education and opportunities mostly to major Indian metropolitan cities. We have Naga Student bodies in almost all the major Indian cities and most of them are celebrating more than 40 years of existence. Workers with STEM qualifications have become increasingly important to global prosperity and unsurprisingly, China is leading the way. STEM graduates perform better when it comes to analytical thinking, critical problem-solving skills as they are the one who uses technology the most.

Coming back to our state and our education, only a small portion of our students go into the STEM field. The reason may be that we are still far behind to get a taste of the new Technology era or we don't have available education institution that provides STEM education. Our generation is about to experience Third machine age and to survive in the age of AI and big data, people

with tech skills will progress more than the rest because those who own the data will own the future. And already today, the richest 1 per cent owns half the world's wealth. Even more alarming, the richest hundred people together own more than the poorest 4 billion.

Through my meetings and conversations with intellectual entrepreneurs, businessmen and industrialist it is of the opinion that "Tourism and IT will be the one that will lead every other industry to change". Today you can let Google, Microsoft book your favourite hotel room just by speaking to your Google Assistant or Microsoft Cortana.
